Russell A. Faust, MD, PhD, Ear, Nose and Throat Specialist,

Receives Award from National Medical Society

Alexandria, VA – Russell A. Faust, MD, PhD, of Children’s Hospital and Research Center of Michigan, has been named a recipient of the **prestigious Honor Award** bestowed by the American Academy of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery. The award will be presented during the Opening Ceremony of the Annual Meeting of the American Academy of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery Foundation, September 22, 2002, at the San Diego Convention Center, San Diego, California.

For the past 67 years, the Academy has presented Honor Awards to medical professionals in recognition of outstanding service through the presentation of instructional courses, scientific papers, and participation on a continuing education committee or faculty. Dr. Faust is recognized for his continued service to the Academy through presentation of instruction courses, participation on academic committees, and presentation of scientific research.

Dr. Faust obtained his doctor of philosophy degree (Ph.D.) in molecular biology from the University of Washington, Seattle; he subsequently graduated from the University of Minnesota (UMN) Medical School, where he remained to complete a research fellowship and otolaryngology residency training. He was faculty at UMN before joining the faculty in Otolaryngology at Johns Hopkins University, where he received subspecialty training in Pediatric Otolaryngology at Johns Hopkins University. Dr. Faust is currently the Carls Foundation Endowed Chair and Chief of Pediatric Otolaryngology at Children’s Hospital of Michigan, where he tirelessly crusades to mandate newborn hearing screening in the state of Michigan. He specializes in management of the pediatric airway, in complicated pediatric ear disease, and teaches at both Wayne State University and Henry Ford Hospital.

Dr. Faust resides in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, with his wife Lori.
